The Arrows (featuring Davie Allan) - 1963


Song: "Apache"/"Blues Theme"

The Arrows placed 7 singles and albums on the Billboard charts beginning with "Apache". The group performed on over 30 motion picture soundtracks, including the Mike Curb composed soundtrack "The Wild Angels" starring Peter Fonda and Nancy Sinatra, which was a massive motion picture and record hit. The single, "Blues Theme", which Curb co-wrote and co-produced was a #1 record in Los Angeles and hit the Top 40 of the Hot 100 in 1967. The group was formed by Davie Allan, Mike Curb, and Larry Brown who performed together while they were in high school in Los Angeles in the early 1960s.

The Hondells - 1964

Song: "Go Little Honda (You Meet The Nicest People On A Honda)"

Mike Curb wrote 10 songs and co-produced 15 songs for The Hondells including, "Go Little Honda (You Meet The Nicest People On A Honda)"





which was used by Honda as their commercial theme.

Skaterdater - 1965 Song: "Skaterdater Rock" "Skaterdater" was a short film that was nominated for an Academy Award and won the Cannes Film Festival award. The film was one of the first to use rock music as a soundtrack and was written and performed by Mike Curb and his group The Sidewalk Sounds.



The Electric Flag - 1966

Song: "Green and Gold"

Mike Curb signed The Electric Flag in 1966 as part of a soundtrack for Roger Corman and Jack Nicholson's movie, "The Trip". The group consisted of Mike Bloomfield and Buddy Miles who went on to be one of the great rock drummers of all time.



Stone Poneys - 1966 Songs: "So Fine/ Everybody Has Their Own Ideas"

In 1966 Mike Curb signed The Stone Poneys, featuring Linda Ronstadt, to Curb's Sidewalk record label. Both sides of the first recording, "So Fine" and "Everybody Has Their Own Ideas", produced by Mike Curb, became classics because they were Linda Ronstadt's first recordings and Ronstadt chose to close the box set of her life works with these recordings.





The Ventures and Casey Kasem - 1967

Song: "Theme From The Wild Angels"

Mike's closest friend was Casey Kasem who created 'The American Top 40' radio show. Mike was the 1st sponsor of the show. Casey gave Mike's song, "Theme From the Wild Angels" to future Rock & Roll Hall of Fame inductees The Ventures.



Chicago Transit Authority - 1968 Song: "Questions 67 and 68"



"I was fortunate to be partnered with James William Guercio who was an amazing producer, manager and record man. We signed the group to the Poseidon record label and later entered into a production agreement with Columbia where the group released their first single, "Questions 67 and 68" under the name Chicago Transit Authority, later shortened to Chicago."



Max Frost and the Troopers - 1968

Song: "Nothing Can Change The Shape Of Things To Come"

Mike Curb produced the soundtrack album for the motion picture "Wild In The Streets", and signed and produced Max Frost and the Troopers whose single, "Nothing Can Change The Shape Of Things To Come" went on to become a significant hit on the Billboard Hot 100 in 1968.



The Savage Seven - 1969

Song: "Anyone For Tennis"
Mike Curb worked with Atlantic chairman Ahmet
Ertegan to produce the soundtrack album for the
motion picture "Savage Seven" which featured Cream
and Iron Butterfly.





American Bandstand - 1969

Song: "Bandstand Theme"

Mike Curb composed the theme for Dick Clark's American Bandstand television show.

"American Bandstand is a legend in the music business--and so are you, Mike. Thanks for writing the Bandstand theme song"-- Dick Clark

Hank Williams Jr. - 1969

Songs: "All My Rowdy Friends Are Coming Over Tonight" / "All For The Love of Sunshine"



Many people believe that Hank Williams Jr. is the greatest country-rock singer of all time. Mike Curb signed him in 1969 and co-wrote and co-produced his 1st #1 single, "All For The Love Of Sunshine".

Hank went on to have over 100 Billboard chart records with Curb, encompassing a 40-year relationship which included hits such as "All My Rowdy Friends Are Coming Over Tonight" which was the theme song for the National Football League for many years.

Eric Burdon & War - 1970

Song: "Spill The Wine"

Mike Curb signed Eric Burdon & War in 1970 and their 1st single, "Spill The Wine" hit #1 on the National Cashbox Chart and was #3 on the Billboard Hot 100.




Five Man Electrical Band - 1970

Song: "Signs"

Solomon Burke recorded R&B versions of "All For The Love Of Sunshine" and "I Got You". Both songs were co-written by Mike Curb. Curb also co-produced Solomon's tribute to Dr. Martin Luther King Jr. which featured The Mike Curb Congregation. The song, "I Have A Dream" contains Dr. King's actual voice.

The Five Man Electrical Band was signed by Mike Curb in 1970 and their 1st single, "Signs" went to #3 on the Billboard Hot 100 in 1971. The song went on to become a classic and later became a hit by other artists. "Signs" became a Top 10 record for

the group Tesla in 1991.





Zabriskie Point - 1970 Song: "So Young" Mike Curb supervised the soundtrack featuring Pink Floyd and The Grateful Dead for the Michelangelo Antonioni picture "Zabriskie Point". Mike composed the theme song "So Young" with Roy Orbison and

Bobby Bloom - 1970 Song: "Montego Bay" Mike Curb and Barry Gibb with Barbara Orbison celebrating the 60th anniversary of Roy Orbison's 1st hit which was recorded at the historic RCA Studio B where Elvis Presley and numerous other artists recorded hits. Studio B is now owned, and has been restored by the Mike Curb Foundation.



Mike Curb signed Bobby Bloom in 1970. Bobby, who was an amazing rock singer, had a Top 10 hit with his ist single, "Montego Bay".

Orbison performed the song for the film.

Kelly's Heroes - 1971

Song: "Burning Bridges" Mike Curb composed the theme for Clint Eastwood's motion picture "Kelly's Heroes" entitled "Burning Bridges". The record, performed by The Mike Curb Congregation, hit the Top 40 of the Billboard Hot 100.

Lou Rawls - 1971

Song: "Natural Man"

Lou Rawls is considered one of the greatest Rock/Blues singers of all time. Mike Curb signed him in 1971 and his recording of "Natural Man" was a major hit on the Hot 100 and won a GRAMMY for the best R&B Male vocal. The Mike Curb Congregation performed with him on that recording as well.



Al Bell of Stax Records to create the "Shaft" soundtrack album featuring Isaac Hayes. Curb then recorded a vocal version of "Shaft" with Sammy Davis Jr. and the song went on to become an Academy Award winning song. "If Mike Curb had not worked with us to produce the film soundtrack to "Shaft" and the money that we made on the soundtrack which out-grossed the film, then I'm here to tell you that there never would have been a Wattstax."-Al Bell






Curb also produced "The Candy Man" by Sammy Davis Jr. which went to #1 on the Billboard Hot 100 as a duet with The Mike Curb Congregation. "My "Candy Man" record is Gold-don't forget it. I waited 43 years for that, but it took the talents of a lot of people...first of all, the belief that Mike Curb had." -Sammy Davis Jr.

The Sylvers - 1972

Song: "Wish I Could Talk To You"
The Sylvers were signed by Mike Curb in
1972 and their first 3 recordings became
R&B hits and Billboard Hot 100 chart
records. Their record, "Wish I Could Talk
To You" was Top 10 on the Billboard R&B
chart and started their very successful
recording career.

Neil Sedaka - 1973

Song: "Standing On The Inside"
Curb signed Neil Sedaka in 1973 and his first recording, "Standing On The Inside" became his first significant record in over a decade. It became a hit in England. After that he signed with Elton John's Rocket label.



Jim Stafford - 1973

Song: "Spiders And Snakes"

Jim Stafford had 4 major hits on the Billboard Hot 100 including "Spiders And Snakes" that went to #3 on the Billboard chart.

Jim Stafford's recordings were produced by Phil Gernhard who played a major role for over 30 years with Mike Curb.





Johnny Bristol - 1974

Johnny Bristol

Song: "Hang On In There Baby"

Johnny Bristol was signed by Curb in 1974 and his first single, "Hang On In There Baby" hit the Top 10 of the Billboard Hot 100 in the middle of 1974.

Gloria Gaynor - 1974

Song: "Never Can Say Goodbye"





Mike Curb signed Gloria Gaynor in 1974. Her first recording for Curb was "Never Can Say Goodbye" which was in the Top 10 on the Billboard Hot 100 and became the first #1 record on the Billboard Dance chart in 1974.



The Four Seasons - 1975 Songs: "Who Loves You"/ "December 1963 (Oh What A Night)"



The Four Seasons featuring Frankie Valli and Bob Gaudio are members of The Rock and Roll Hall Of Fame. After several years off the charts they signed with Curb in 1975. Their first single "Who Loves You" went to #3 in 1975 and their second single went all the way to #1 in 1975 and then came back again and became a top 15 record almost 20 years later in 1994. The record, "December 1963 (Oh What A Night)" became the first record to remain on the Billboard Hot 100 Singles chart for over a year.

The Osmonds - 1971-1986

Songs: "One Bad Apple"/ "Down By The Lazy River"/ "Crazy Horses"/ "Love Me For A Reason"

The Osmonds were declared by some critics, including The Utah Saints, as being one of the greatest rock and roll artists ever. Their first #1 recording, "One Bad Apple" drew strong comparisons with Michael Jackson and the Jackson 5. They went on to make other massive Top 5 recordings, including "Down By The Lazy River", "Crazy Horses", and "Love Me For A Reason", which was produced by Mike Curb and remained #1 on the British charts for 3 consecutive weeks. Mike Curb produced over 20 other significant Billboard Hot 100 chart hits with The Osmond Family, including "I'm Leaving It All Up To You", "Morning Side Of The Mountain", "Puppy Love", which remained #1 in England for 5 weeks, and "Long Haired Lover From Liverpool", with The Mike Curb Congregation, which also remained #1 in England for 5 weeks and became the #1 record of the year. "If it hadn't been for Mike, there wouldn't be an Osmonds...we would still be a barbershop quartet"-Merrill Osmond

Shaun Cassidy - 1977

Songs: "Da Doo Ron Ron"/ "Hey Deanie"/ "That's Rock & Roll"



It's always difficult to know the place in history for teen rock and roll singers like

Shaun Cassidy. His teen rock and roll hits were massively successful. He sold millions of albums and hit #1 on the Billboard Hot 100 with

"Da Doo Ron Ron"in 1977. Shaun went on to have other major Hot 100 hits including "Hey Deanie" and "That's Rock & Roll", both written by Eric Carmen.

LET YOUR LOVE FLOW

Song: "Let Your Love Flow"

The Bellamy Brothers began their career as a rock duo and hit #1 on the Billboard Hot 100 with their single "Let Your Love Flow" in 1976.

Foreigner - 1977

Song: "Feels Like The First Time"



Mike and his brother-in-law, Tony Scotti, were involved from the very beginning with Foreigner.

Unfortunately, their distributing partner at the time, Warner, passed on the artist for the Warner/Curb label and Tony had the idea to take the group to Atlantic. Tony and Mike received a royalty for the early Foreigner albums until the group's interest was sold to Atlantic.

Sawyer Brown - 1984

Song: "Some Girls Do"

Sawyer Brown was signed by Mike Curb and Dick Whitehouse to Curb Records in 1984 while they were succeeding as a rock



and roll band on Star Search. Although originally signed as a rock and roll band, Sawyer Brown became the rock and roll band for country music. Curb Records had over 50 Billboard chart records with the group, including #1 hits such as "Some Girls Do", which is a country rock classic.

The Judds - 1984

Songs: "Rockin' With The Rhythm Of The Rain"/
"Let Me Tell You About Love" (with Carl Perkins)



The Judds became the top country pop rock duo of the 80s and 90s with 38 chart records including #1 records such as "Rockin' With The Rhythm Of The Rain" and "Let Me Tell You About Love", which was a duet with Rock and Roll hall of famer Carl Perkins.

Exile - 1978 Song: "Kiss You All Over"



A Southern rock band who hit #1 on the Billboard Hot 100 with the recording "Kiss You All Over".
Curb signed the group in 1978 and they hit #1 later that year.

Real Life - 1983 & 1989

Song: "Send Me An Angel"

Real Life was an Australian rock band. Their hit record, "Send Me An Angel" had the rare distinction of hitting the Billboard Hot 100 in 2 separate successful runs in 1983 and again in 1989. The group spent a combined 35 weeks on the Billboard Hot 100 with their hit "Send Me An Angel".



Sparks - 1985

Song: "Music That You Can Dance To"



One of the most trendy rock bands from the West Coast was the group Sparks. Many consider Sparks' most classic hit to be "Music That You Can Dance To" that became a hit in 1986 from the "Rad" soundtrack on Curb Records.

Lyle Lovett - 1986 Song: "You've Been So Good Up To Now"



Lyle Lovett won 4
GRAMMYs and had
several Billboard hits and
became one of the most
important multi-genre
artists.

The Righteous Brothers Bill Medley - 1987

Songs: "Unchained Melody"/ "I've Had The Time Of My Life" Rock and Roll Hall of Fame members. The Righteous Brothers signed with Curb in the late 80s and scored a major hit with the re-recording of "Unchained Melody" which was released in 1990 on the Curb label and became The Righteous Brothers' first platinum single. Lead singer Bill Medley also recorded for Curb. Michael Lloyd, with Mike Curb Productions recorded the #1 hit on the Billboard Hot 100 in 1987, "I've Had The Time Of My Life", from the motion picture "Dirty Dancing". The song won the Academy Award.

The Beat Farmers - 1987 Song: "Dark Light"

Ronnie McDowell - 1987

Songs: "Never Too Old To Rock And Roll" (with Jerry Lee Lewis)/ "It's Only Make Believe" (with Conway Twitty)/

"Unchained Melody"







Ronnie McDowell started his career with "The King Is Gone", a tribute to Elvis Presley. For many years most people thought Ronnie sounded more like Elvis and interpreted Elvis' music better than any other artist. Ronnie had many hits but his recording of "Unchained Melody" on Curb caused Bill Medley to state that he could always tell the difference in Ronnie's version from other versions because Ronnie's artistry was so amazing. Ronnie had other Billboard chart recordings including, "Never Too Old To Rock And Roll", with Jerry Lee Lewis and his top 10 recording of "It's Only Make Believe" with Conway Twitty.

The Desert Rose Band - 1988

Song: "She Don't Love Nobody"

The Desert Rose Band consisted of Rock and Roll hall of famer Chris Hillman, Herb Pedersen and John Jorgenson. They had Billboard #1 hits and were considered one of the top country rock bands of the late 1980s and early 1990s.



Wynonna - 1992

Evan Almighty - 2007



"I Don't Dance", "I Hope You're Happy Now", "Drinking Class", "One of Them Girls", "Soul", and "Memory I Don't Mess With". Lee Brice had a hit in every single year of our 6th decade.











A significant development this decade occurred in 2016 when Curb purchased Word Entertainment.




